Rotary's senior leaders are responsible for appointing members to key leadership positions. Because these positions are appointment-based, those with robust networks have a significant advantage of being named a Rotary leader, regardless of their knowledge or skills.

Many Rotary leadership roles require you to first be a district governor In fact, $85 \%$ of members who serve as a committee, regional, or senior leader or received a presidential appointment were once district governors. This requirement though limits who can be a senior leader within the district, region, and organization.
