To request the RI Board to consider appointing an ad hoc committee to examine the need for a program focused on children under the age of 12 years

- WHEREAS, it is well recognized by educational psychologists and teachers that 1
- early childhood education and development plays a critical role in shaping the 2 citizens of tomorrow, and 3
- 4
- WHEREAS, one of Rotary's seven areas of focus is the encouragement and 5
- support of education and literacy, particularly for girls, and 6
- 7 8 WHEREAS, RI currently does not have a recognized program for children under
- 12 years old. Many Rotary clubs and districts have developed and support 9
- activities that contribute to children's early learning, and 10
- 11
- WHEREAS, if such an outreach were endorsed through a recognized RI program, 12
- clubs would be encouraged to extend and strengthen their relationships with 13 schools and parents, and 14
- 15
- 16 WHEREAS, such a program would provide an additional pathway for children to progress through the Family of Rotary 17
- 18
- IT IS RESOLVED by Rotary International that the Board of Directors of Rotary 19
- International consider appointing an ad hoc committee to examine the need for 20
- and importance of developing a program focused on children under the age of 12 21 22 vears.

PURPOSE AND EFFECT

- It is recognized that many Rotary clubs throughout the world have forged strong 23
- 24 links with local schools and parent organizations to help form, encourage, and
- support activities for children under the age of 12 years old. 25
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- 27 The Rotary movement, with its strong ethics and areas of focus, provides a
- powerful model for early childhood education which is recognized by partner 28 organizations, schools, and parent groups. 29
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- Across the Rotary world, clubs for children less than 12 years of age have been 31
- developed and encouraged at regional, district, and local levels without any unified 32
- guidance from RI relating to their programs and position in our communities. 33

- 1 Such clubs often use locally derived descriptors, programs and branding. While
- 2 this does not detract from the excellent work that our clubs are achieving at the
- 3 local level, it is contrary to our needs and aspirations as an international
- 4 organization with globally recognized branding.
- 5
- 6 The continued growth today of these clubs has many similarities to the need that
- 7 led to the recognition and developments of Rotary's Interact Club movement in
- 8 1962. A program for children in this age range will help them to learn about the
- 9 importance of working together to make a difference in their local and
- 10 international communities.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

- 11 If implemented, this resolution would result in an increase in expenses for RI.
- 12 Committee costs are primarily driven by meeting expenses and staff support.
- 13 Actual meeting expenses for a six-member committee would be nominal for a
- 14 virtual meeting, or approximately US\$24,500 for an in-person meeting, mainly
- 15 for airfare, hotel, and meals. The related indirect cost for additional time
- 16 provided by existing staff to support the committee is estimated at US\$33,000.
