RESOLUTION 23R-07

To request the RI Board to consider recommending that each district establish a district Council on Legislation committee

Proposer(s): District 2680, Japan

WHEREAS, currently, enactments and resolutions are proposed by clubs and 1 districts throughout the world and are considered by the Council on Legislation and 2 the Council on Resolutions. All districts elect a single representative, who may cast 3 one vote for each item considered by the Council on Legislation, convened 4 triennially in person, and the Council on Resolutions, which meets annually online, 5 6 and 7 8 WHEREAS, in preparing enactments and resolutions, it is necessary to go through the process of receiving proposals from the clubs in each district and compiling the 9 opinions in the district. It would be a significant burden to delegate these tasks to a 10 single representative, and 11 12 WHEREAS, it cannot be denied, moreover, that the procedure of deliberating and 13 gathering opinions on many enactments and resolutions proposed by districts and 14 clubs around the world may also be an excessive burden if it is left to the 15 16 representative alone, and 17 WHEREAS, noting also that club officers are largely unfamiliar with the RI 18 19 Constitution, RI Bylaws, and Standard Rotary Club Constitution, it would seem essential for the district to to have a committee or some other body within the 20 district responsible for raising awareness of the Council and its activities, and 21 22 WHEREAS, in this respect, a standing Council on Legislation committee could 23 24 prove useful to the district as a liaison for drafting and reviewing proposed legislation 25 26 IT IS RESOLVED by Rotary International that the Board of Directors of Rotary 27 International consider recommending that each district establish a committee 28 relating to the Council on Legislation and the Council on Resolutions, tentatively 29 30 called the district Council on Legislation committee.

PURPOSE AND EFFECT

Since it is natural that the autonomy of each district should be respected, it does not seem appropriate to make the district Council on Legislation committee a

- mandatory committee. It should be a voluntary committee and should only be recommended by the RI Board. Similarly, the organizational and authoritative relationship between the governor, representative, and the district Council on Legislation committee should be left to the discretion of each district.
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- 6 The establishment of a committee in each district to prepare and review
- 7 proposals for the Council on Legislation and Council on Resolutions would
- 8 enhance the general understanding among Rotarians of the RI Constitution, the
- 9 RI Bylaws, the Standard Rotary Club Constitution, and the Recommended Rotary
- 10 Club Bylaws. It would also help to familiarize each club and its members with RI.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

11 If implemented, this resolution would have no substantial financial impact on RI.
