RESOLUTION 24R-09

To request the RI Board to consider recommending that each district establish a District Council on Legislation committee

Proposer(s): Rotary Club of Kobe Seishin, District 2680, Japan

- IT IS RESOLVED by Rotary International that the Board of Directors of Rotary 1
- International consider recommending that each district establish a committee that 2
- is equivalent to the Council on Legislation or the Council on Resolutions of Rotary 3
- International, to be referred to tentatively as the District Council on Legislation 4
- committee. 5

PURPOSE AND EFFECT

Currently, enactments and resolutions are proposed by districts and clubs 6

throughout the world and are then considered by the Council on Legislation and 7

8 the Council on Resolutions. The single representative elected by each district has

- one vote for each item. The Council on Legislation is convened triennially in 9 person, while the Council on Resolutions meets annually to consider resolutions 10
- which are voted on electronically. 11
- 12

In preparing enactments and resolutions, it is necessary to go through the 13

process of receiving proposals from the clubs in each district and compiling the 14

opinions in the district. It is already a significant burden for a single 15

- representative to handle these tasks. 16
- 17
- 18 It cannot be denied, moreover, that the procedure of deliberating and gathering
- opinions on many enactments and resolutions, proposed by districts and clubs 19
- around the world, may also be an excessive burden if it is left to the 20
- representative alone. 21
- 22

Noting also that club presidents and secretaries are unfamiliar with the RI 23

24 Constitution, the RI Bylaws, and the Standard Club Constitution, it would seem

necessary to have a body that is in charge of promoting and raising awareness of 25

- the deliberations of the Council on Legislation or Council on Resolutions. 26
- 27

Therefore, it would be desirable to establish a District Council on Legislation 28

committee within each district that would be responsible for developing, 29

- promoting, raising awareness about, and deliberating upon each of these 30
- proposals. 31

- Since it is natural that the autonomy of each district should be respected, it does 1 not seem appropriate to make the District Council on Legislation committee a 2 mandatory committee. It should be a voluntary committee and should only be 3 4 recommended by the RI Board. Similarly, the organizational and authoritative relationship between the governor, the representative, and the District Council 5 6 on Legislation committee should be left to the discretion of the district, which shall decide whether this committee should be a fully independent committee or 7 8 merely an advisory body of representatives. 9 The establishment of this committee in each district to prepare and deliberate on 10 proposals for each Council on Legislation and Council on Resolutions would help 11 to enhance Rotarians' awareness of the RI Constitution, the RI Bylaws, and the 12
- 13 Standard Rotary Club Constitution, as well as the Recommended Rotary Club
- 14 Bylaws. It would also help to increase general awareness about RI at the club level.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

15 If implemented, this resolution would have no substantial financial impact on RI.
