- International consider requesting the Trustees of The Rotary Foundation to consider 15
- 16 modifying the (DDF) SHARE allocation ratio for district grants from 50:50 to 60:40.

- As a result of the ongoing worldwide decline in Rotary membership, it has 17
- 18 become necessary for clubs to actively engage in service activities that contribute
- to the sustainable development of the community. By reducing the financial 19
- burden assumed by clubs in conducting community service activities, they can 20
- actively plan and implement service activities. 21

- Clubs that engage in local community service activities will receive recognition 23
- 24 from their communities, retain and grow their membership, and help to
- positively impact Rotary's public image. 25

- Furthermore, an increase in the DDF SHARE percentage for district grants would 27
- reduce the amount of unused district grant funds, resulting in more effective use 28
- of contributions. It might also motivate Rotarians and clubs to increase their 29
- contributions. 30
