PURPOSE AND EFFECT

This resolution requests the RI Board to allow districts to include both Rotarians and Rotaractors in their overall district membership count by aligning the RI and district membership reporting processes.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

If implemented, this resolution would have a financial impact on RI which cannot be determined at this time. Cost would be dependent on the scope and extent of support provided by the RI Board to accomplish this goal.

 Currently, Rotary does not have an accurate count of Rotaractors. Allowing districts to combine their Rotaract and Rotarian membership numbers would require significant system changes and could potentially impact necessary district consolidations. In addition, the two member types are invoiced at different rates and frequencies, which would complicate the data analytics and financial systems.
