To request the RI Board to consider encouraging districts to observe an annual Hygiene Day

WHEREAS, hygiene is an integral part of several of Rotary's areas of focus, and 1 2 WHEREAS, the number of underprivileged people increases regularly 3 throughout the world, and 4 5 WHEREAS, these people are unable to afford even the most basic hygiene 6 products 7 8 IT IS RESOLVED by Rotary International that the Board of Directors of Rotary 9 International consider encouraging districts to observe an annual Hygiene Day 10 on which clubs collect basic women's, men's, and children's hygiene products in 11 order to assemble hygiene kits for distribution to or through local organizations 12 specializing in providing assistance for the underprivileged. 13

PURPOSE AND EFFECT

Many Rotary clubs are encouraged by their districts to collect food during a special day for underprivileged people. If food is important for these people, so is hygiene. It's just as important a health factor but also tends to be more costly and can therefore be easily overlooked as a club service activity.

The work of Rotary clubs can be key in motivating community members to buy hygiene products as a means of helping those who cannot afford them.

This work falls under several of Rotary's areas of focus, such as disease prevention, mother and child health, and education.

In addition, any progress in this area can have a positive impact on health, community life, and health care costs.

Districts can take on the responsibility of encouraging their clubs to dedicate one day to this natural and very useful work annually.
