To request the Trustees to consider consolidating districts' DDF for district and global grants

Proposer(s): Rotary Club of Kobe Naka, District 2680, Japan

WHEREAS, the foundation of a Rotary club is the community to which it belongs. 1 Rotary clubs cannot exist without the sustainable economic development of the 2 3 community, and 4 WHEREAS, in order for clubs to be accepted by the community and enhance their 5 public image, it is essential for them to conduct service activities that are relevant and 6 responsive to the issues the community faces as well as to engage in projects with a 7 8 broader, more global focus, and 9 WHEREAS, of the contributions from club members to The Rotary Foundation, only 10 23.75 percent of such funds will be available to clubs and districts as district grants 11 and an equal percentage as global grants by way of District Designated Funds (DDF) 12 after three years, and 13 14 WHEREAS, depending on the specifics of its individual situation, each district should 15 16 have discretionary authority over how such grant funds are to be used 17 IT IS RESOLVED by Rotary International that the Board of Directors of Rotary 18 19 International consider requesting the Trustees of The Rotary Foundation to consider consolidating districts' DDF for district and global grants, rather than separating 20 them, thereby leaving the districts to manage the use of their own grant funds. 21 (End of Text) PURPOSE AND EFFECT One of the priorities of the 2024-25 annual goals for RI and The Rotary 22

and sustainable economic development of the community. Community-based service activities that are accepted by the community and aimed at solving local issues are now required of Rotary.

Likewise, in some areas, there is a demand to view local communities from a global perspective and actively engage in volunteer activities with a global focus.

Districts, clubs, and members should be allowed to focus their attention on different service activities based on their own individual situations. If district grants and global grants, which are generated from annual giving DDF, are divided at a fixed rate as they currently are, there would be either a surplus or a deficit of funds in each specific case, thereby leading to an overall decrease in such activities. Therefore, respecting each district as its own first and best steward of its own funds, eliminating the fixed rate for the usage of grant funds, combining district grants and global grants into district grants and leaving the use of grant funds to the discretion of the districts would create more active service activities, enhance our public image, increase our membership and grow Rotary. Furthermore, Rotarians and Rotary clubs will be more willing to contribute to the Annual Fund, leading to increased contributions.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

If implemented, this resolution could have a significant financial impact on The Rotary Foundation which cannot be determined at this time. Cost would be dependent on the scope and extent of support provided by The Rotary Foundation to accomplish this goal.

This would be a significant policy change within the Foundation. Both Rotary's financial management system and Rotary's grant management databases would require substantial modifications.
